

Revival of knowledge in the Muslim World: Methodological Approaches

JULY 3-9, 2017 ISTANBUL

After having successfully conducted three Summer School Programs, such as "Transformation of the Muslim World in the 21st century", "State and Society in the Muslim World," and "Social Justice and Poverty in the Muslim World," in the past years, the main theme of this year's 4th ILEM International Summer School will be "Revival of Knowledge in the Muslim World: Methodological Approaches"

Muslims are living in an era of an intellectual crisis. In order to be freed from this crisis, the Muslim world is investigating the possibilities of reconnecting with the tradition of Islamic knowledge and science and the betterment of this tradition. This effort brings with itself the question of which methodology should be followed when putting the accumulation of Islamic thought into circulation.

In this framework, with the "Revival of Knowledge in the Muslim World: Methodological Approaches" theme, topics of Islamic politics, economics, philosophy of Islam, and reconstruction of Islamic society will be addressed. Rather than approaching Islamic science merely as historic data, the possibility of reinterpreting Islamic tradition and its synthesis will be examined according to the economic, political and social conditions in which modern Muslims live.

Conferences, seminars, lectures, and workshops will be held in Istanbul July 3-9 and opening ceremony will be on 3 July, hosted by Istanbul Medeniyet University.

With these workshops, the aim is to produce a common procedure and methodology for the process of reinterpreting Islamic thought, and a projection of how to assess current Is-lamic intellectual accumulation. The problems with revival of Islamic knowledge will be discussed by academics coming from disciplines of politics, economics, philosophy, law, theology, sociology, and so on. We would like to thank our supporters; Mavera Foundation, Turkish Airlines, and Istanbul Medeniyet University who collectively have worked to organize the program.

Istanbul Medeniyet University



Ihsan Fazlioglu was born in Ankara in 1966 and completed studies at İstanbul University in the Department of Philosophy in 1989, his M.A. in the history of science in 1993, and his PhD in Philosophy. He con-ducted research at the University of Jordan (Amman) and the Arab Institute for the His-tory of Science in Aleppo on the history of science and mathematics. He also worked as a researcher in the Department of Manuscripts at the International Research Center of Islamic Culture and Arts (IRCICA) from 1987-1996, including a period in Cairo during 1994. He focuses on the history and philosophy of mathematics in Islamic and Turkish History. Fazlıoğlu holds a teaching post at Istanbul Medeniyet University and teaching; History of Science, Intellectual History, Philosophy of Mathematics.

Wael B. Hallaq Columbia University



Wael B. Hallaq is a scholar of Islamic law and Islamic intellectual history. His teaching and research deal with the problematic epistemic ruptures generated by the onset of modernity and the socio-politico-historical forces subsumed by it; with the intellectual history of Orientalism and the repercussions of Orientalist paradigms in later scholarship and in Islamic legal studies as a whole; and with the synchronic and diachronic development of Islamic traditions of logic, legal theory, and substantive law and the interdependent systems within these traditions. Hallaq's writings have explored the structural dynamics of legal change in pre-modern law, and have recently been examining the centrality of moral theory to understanding the history of Islamic law and modern political movements.

Muhammad Akram Khan

Pakistan



Mr. Muhammad Akram Khan, took post-graduate degrees from Pakistan (1966) and UK (1967) and joined Department of the Auditor General of Pakistan where he rose to the position of Deputy Auditor General (1999-2002). He served the UN Office of Internal Oversight from 2003-2007 as Chief Auditor of Peacekeeping Missions. He has consulted with UN, WB, OSCE, FAO, and Govt of Pakistan. He is a pioneer in the effective use of Performance Auditing with over 40 years' experience as audit profession-al. He developed the Performance Auditing methodology used by the Department of the Auditor General, Pakistan. He has published 15 books and 46 research papers on various aspects of auditing and public finance. He pursues Islamic economics as a hobby and has published 20 books, 55 research papers and about 100 book reviews on various aspects of Islamic economics. His seminal work 'What is Wrong with Islamic Economics: Analysing the Present State and Future Agenda' was published by Edward Elgar (UK &USA) in 2013.
